Description: Create an illustrated timeline poster showing events leading up to American Revolution from 1754 through 1776.



Fitle: Must be something creative and catchy

Events: Choose 4 events that helped cause the American Revolution. Pick events that somehow represent 3 different themes (BAGPIPE).

- Labels: All events must be clearly labeled, in chronological order, on the timeline
- o Pictures: Each event must have a hand-drawn picture in color
- Sentences: Each event must have at least one sentence <u>DESCRIBING</u> WHAT IT WAS, at least one sentence <u>EXPLAINING</u> WHY IT WAS IMPORTANT in leading to the Revolution, and one sentence <u>EXPLAINING</u> THE THEMATIC CONNECTION (how does the event fit with the chosen theme).



- o **Title:** Give the title, date, author of the written selection
- o **Quote**: Copy one significant quote from the selection
- 4 Sentences: Write one sentence <u>DESCRIBING</u> THE <u>QUOTE</u>, one sentence <u>EXPLAINING</u> THE
 <u>RHETORICAL STRATEGY OR TONE</u>, one sentence <u>EXPLAINING</u> ONE <u>ASPECT OF SOAP</u> (from SOAPSTone), and one sentence <u>EXPLAINING</u> THE <u>CONNECTION</u> between the piece and the causes of the Revolution
