


Description: Create an illustrated timeline poster showing events leading up to American Revolution from 1754 through 1776.

Criteria:

 **Title:** Must be something creative and catchy

 **Events:** Choose 4 events that helped cause the American Revolution. Pick events that somehow represent 3 different themes (BAGPIPE).

- o **Labels:** All events must be clearly labeled, in chronological order, on the timeline
- o **Pictures:** Each event must have a hand-drawn picture in color
- o **3 Sentences:** Each event must have at least one sentence **DESCRIBING** WHAT IT WAS, at least one sentence **EXPLAINING** WHY IT WAS IMPORTANT in leading to the Revolution, and one sentence **EXPLAINING** THE THEMATIC CONNECTION(how does the event fit with the chosen theme).

 **Literary Aspect:** Choose four appropriate written pieces that were connected to the causes of the American Revolution.

- o **Title:** Give the title, date, author of the written selection
- o **Quote:** Copy one significant quote from the selection
- o **4 Sentences:** Write one sentence **DESCRIBING** THE QUOTE, one sentence **EXPLAINING** THE RHETORICAL STRATEGY OR TONE, one sentence **EXPLAINING** ONE ASPECT OF SOAP (from SOAPStone), and one sentence **EXPLAINING** THE CONNECTION between the piece and the causes of the Revolution

Minimum of four written selections are listed, described, and quoted	8	
Four appropriate sentences about each written selection (one describe, two explain, one connection to causation)	36	
Timeline has a title, is neat, creative, and uses correct mechanics	12	
Extra Credit: up to 2 additional events or written selections may be added for UP TO five points each (Must reflect excellent work using the above criteria to earn extra points)	10
